

ARIZONA SCHOOL DISTRICTS

DYSART UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

Dysart Unified School District initially scanned approximately 300,000 student records. Once the records were converted into electronic files, ICM created a custom software application using Visual Basic to allow the district staff to easily find student information. They can search now by entering a first or last name and narrow the search using a middle initial, date of birth, and school. Dysart continues to have their student records scanned into electronic files each year. ICM performs the process and adds the files to the School District's database.

ROOSEVELT SCHOOL DISTRICT

Roosevelt School District needed to manage their special education records and student records electronically to improve efficiency and reduce their storage needs. This was especially important because they had approximately 800,000 records to manage. ICM scanned these documents into electronic files and indexed them so they could be imported into Roosevelt's document management system.

PEORIA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

Peoria Unified School District had accumulated approximately 400,000 pages of special education student records. ICM scanned these into electronic files, indexed them by student name and date of birth, and created a database to manage these files so the district staff could easily search and find the records in seconds. Now, Peoria scans their student records in-house and sends their backlog to ICM as needed.

ISAAC SCHOOL DISTRICT

Isaac School District needed a fast, easy way to access only student record cards, birth certificates, and immunization records. These documents were mixed in with other student information within student folders. ICM offered a solution—pull these documents and convert them into electronic files. Out of more than 40,000 student files, they scanned an estimated 240,000 pages. For easy viewing, ICM created a database to organize records by student name, date of birth, and school. Now records can be accessed by employees working in the district office, welcome center, and schools. Each year, ICM scans these records and adds them to the school district's viewing database.
